Transformational Ministry Program springs into life-changing action

Love INC of Sheboygan County has launched the Transformational Ministry or "TM" Program after three years of extensive training, equipping, and internal development. The purpose of the TM Program is to enter into mentoring relationships with anyone seeking to obtain greater self-sufficiency by completing classes focused on setting and achieving goals, developing untapped resources within an individual and fostering self-discovery on how an individual can become their best self, the image that God created them to be!

achieving those goals. Mentors come into play throughout this class at different times, for different purposes like Group Discussion Leaders, Dream Tool Coaches, Trail Guides, and Progress Reviewers.

Our second class is Faith & Finances, a 12-week course that "[unites] people from varied financial backgrounds and exploring together money management skills and biblical stewardship principles. Designed specifically for low-income adults. Faith & Finances addresses the challenges the materially poor face and helps them rediscover their God-given dignity." (Chalmers. org) Mentors of Faith & Finances called Allies, walk with participants through the class. Allies later serve as budget counselors after the class, meeting with their participant match each week to review their financial progress and budgeting accountability.

Transformational Ministry classes are incentive-driven, utilizing Love Bucks, the official currency of the Love INCTM Program. Weekly attendance and homework completion are required to earn Love Bucks, which can be spent on Gap Ministry Kits like Bedding & Linens, Starter Kitchen Kits, Love Buckets, and Personal Care Kits, at the end of the 12-week session.

Providing a hand up to struggling Neighbors recognizes the core values of Redemptive Compassion, which state that everyone has value, everyone has capacity and potential, mutual participation is important, we must use wisdom and discernment in our responses, what we do should help transform lives, and that we are all called to invest relationally in July Purpose each other. Through the Transformational Ministry Program, we are able to provide a hand up which encourages, inspires, and invests in the person and their future, not just their immediate need.

Will you join us as we prayerfully lift our hearts, minds, hands, and feet to action of redemptive service with our Neighbors? We are continually seeking program meal donors, childcare Volunteers, greeters, kitchen crew, and Mentors for Affirming Potential, Faith & Finances, and future classes. The philosophies of Redemptive Compassion bring forth a new understanding of how and why generational poverty has become so pervasive in the United States. The importance of focusing on individuals and not just their needs requires a paradigm shift that challenges current helping methods. Several Love INC Partnered Church groups - Hope Reformed Church, Grace Episcopal, Renew



Ministries, Zion Covenant, and Bethany Lutheran Church in Kohler - have completed the invaluable book study of Redemptive Compassion.

After members of Zion Covenant Church completed the Redemptive

Compassion book study, Pastor Ethan Tews shared this powerful testimony: "I think we all found it insightful because we learned things about generational poverty that we did not know before. It was convicting and challenging because we were confronted with some things that we had faulty pre-conceived notions or biases about that hit with what Jesus was really calling us and the Church to do. There were some hard lessons to learn. Finally, it was transformative because it changed the way we thought about generational poverty and people in need, and it taught us how to help them and be a role model and mentor."

We encourage you and your Church to complete the Redemptive Compassion book study as a Church body or in small groups. The eye-opening, aha-moments discovered through the book study will make vividly clear how so many Americans have fallen into poverty and how our good intentions have contributed to poverty. Learn why we need to turn it around, and how we can make the changes needed to help our brothers and sisters break free from the bondage of poverty.
